The Club at ARROW CREEK

So it's been the year of the pump station nightmares, up to this point anyway.

Our new and final pump should be here sometime this month. Even with our new sprinkler heads, the new pump will solve our pressure and coverage issues. It seems like we're constantly trying to catch-up after a pump station malfunction. Of course we're also dealing with broken pipes, faulty valves, etc., which takes up much of our time. I wish we were spending more time on tweaking the new heads from our Adopt-a-hole sprinkler replacement program, which is now complete, except for the tweaking. By tweaking, I mean heads that are too low and need to be raised, or heads that need different nozzles to maximize proper coverage, or directional adjustments or a change in vertical angle.

This photo of #2 Challenge shows the improvement of the turf after only a month of running the new sprinklers. Another program that we have just recently revived is our fertigation injection program of injecting through the irrigation system on an every 2 week basis, a combination of an organic acid and wetting agent, to treat the water and the soil for salts and bicarbonates in our effluent water that have many negative effects on turf quality. We just started this program again in combination of my spot spraying the worst areas on the courses.



We are also in the process of bumping up our crew numbers to better handle bunker maintenance and all the other detail work that just requires time and bodies.

- **Divots!** Well-struck golf shots produce divots. We as golfers need to fill our divots with sand and seed. I know most golfers have very good intentions and want to fill all of their divots. Sometimes your cart partner may leave you at your ball to hit a shot without your sand and seed bottle. Please think of your sand and seed bottle as your fifteenth club. Anytime you select a club to hit a full shot, take your sand and seed with you. This practice will significantly help our courses!
- **Sunflower seeds** The Club has no official policy against sunflower seeds and we encourage those who may be using them to curb other habits; however we ask that you please be respectful of other golfers and DO NOT spit them out on the greens or tees.
- Please use the trash receptacles on the course or leave the trash in the golf cart for disposal. This includes cigarette/cigar butts; please do not discard them on the golf course especially now that we are experiencing such dry weather conditions!
- **Fix one ball mark per green** whether it is yours or not. The best players in the world average less than 14 greens per round. If we all fix one ball mark on each green we will never have a ball mark issue at The Club at ArrowCreek. Now that we are fully private we can no longer place the blame on outside golfers when we see an unrepaired ball mark.

- **Don't forget that your position** on the golf course is directly behind the group in front of you, not in front of the group behind you. Early morning groups are expected to play in less than 4 hours. Here are a few "tips" to help with pace of play...
 - Keep an extra ball in your pocket at all times.
 - Allow faster groups to play through when possible.
 - When riding together, drop your cart partner at their ball and proceed to your ball. Waiting for them to play, and then proceeding to your ball wastes time.
 - Bring extra clubs to your ball. You may change your strategy on how you would like to play your shot and this will save you from walking back to your cart.
 - Record your score on the next tee. Do not loiter around the green.
 - Prepare for your shots while others are playing theirs. Be ready when it is your turn to play.

• Driving Range Practice - Our range tee is quite busy. As a result we ask all Members to use the linear divot pattern when practicing. This helps increase turf growth recovery and allows us to use our range tee more efficiently than hitting divots all over. Please see the pictures below...




• Players should always observe cart rules and restrictions. Golf carts can cause the most damage on the course and shold never be within 30 yards of a green (per the ArrowCreek Cart / Handicap policy). Please enter and exit the fairways at the designed areas between the two white stakes at the beginning and the end of each fairway. The ArrowCreek team will always address a situation when observed or notified however as Members we encourage you to lead by example and set the bar for your group and/or other Members.
